## RESPONSIBLE MINERALS DUE DILIGENCE LETTER

Dear Valued Customer,

**Amphenol Corporation** ("**Amphenol**") is committed to respecting and promoting human rights worldwide. Per Amphenol's <u>Responsible Minerals Policy</u>, Amphenol has implemented a responsible sourcing program for certain minerals used in the manufacture of our products. Our program seeks to ensure that our products do not contain materials derived from conflict minerals.

To fulfill Section 1502 of Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010 and other industry-driven initiatives, Amphenol initiates an annual Responsible Minerals campaign to collect information on the source of conflict minerals (tungsten, tin, tantalum, gold) and extended minerals (cobalt and mica) in its supply chain to ensure the ethical sourcing of these minerals, utilizing the Responsible Minerals Initiative ("RMI") Conflict Minerals Reporting Template ("CMRT") and Extended Minerals Reporting Template ("EMRT"). Amphenol strives to source from Eligible and Conformant smelters, refiners, and processors, according to the RMI Responsible Minerals Assurance Process ("RMAP"). As such, surveying our supply base is a continual, ongoing process and Amphenol takes prompt action to remove high-risk smelters. Given the size and complexity of our supply chain, removal may take time as many of our direct suppliers are similarly reliant upon information provided by their suppliers.

It has come to our attention that there may be smelters, refiners, or processors of concern in our supply chain. We will conduct further due diligence and will be pursuing updated CMRTs and/or EMRTs from our suppliers to close out this request. If our suppliers applicable to these products confirm that the smelters, refiners, or processors of concern were present in the supply chain for these goods, our current CMRT and/or EMRT cannot be changed as it reflects the smelters, refiners, or processors utilized during the current reporting year. However, we commit to working to remove the concerned smelters, refiners, or processors from our supply chain before the next reporting period and will update our customers accordingly. Your feedback is welcomed to strengthen our responsible minerals sourcing efforts.
